2020-2021^ IP^: This cohort had 51 students registered; 7 withdrew; 44 students continued; 31 (70%) graduated in August 2022; 6 (14%) graduated in October -November 2022; 37 (84%) of students graduated within two years. Four students graduated in June 2023; three are still registered and continuing their studies. This cohort graduated in 2022. To be licensed as a Marriage and Family Therapy in Florida, a minimum of two years post-master supervised experience is required. This cohort would not be eligible for licensure until fall 2024, at the earliest.

2021 – 2022^^ IP^: This cohort will graduate in fall 2023. To be licensed as a Marriage and Family Therapy in Florida, a minimum of two years post-master supervised experience is required. This cohort would not be eligible for licensure until fall 2025, at the earliest.

2022 – 2023^^^ IP^: This cohort will graduate in fall 2024. To be licensed as a Marriage and Family Therapy in Florida, a minimum of two years post-master supervised experience is required. This cohort would not be eligible for licensure until fall 2026, at the earliest.
